NESSI participated in the meeting organized by the Austrian EU Presidency and the European Commission on "Investing in ICT Research and Innovation/Shaping Europe of Tomorrow - i 2010", in Vienna on March 22-23, 2006

This was an opportunity to collaborate closely with five other ETPs, namely Artemis, Eniac, ISI, eMobility and NEM. The six ETPs issued a common press release, highlighting the opportunity for ETPs to play a key role in the realisation of the Lisbon strategy and the fact that **building on an unobstructed internal market with leading edge applications** is essential to meeting the challenge of global competitors, themselves building on the strength of their respective home markets.

NESSI fully endorses this key message and its Strategic Research Agenda reflects this importance by bringing in a holistic view encompassing a NESSI Framework that will ease the deployment of such leading edge applications.
